10/6/22 Music Hour Recap

This week we were lucky enough to hear from vocalist and ukulele player Tany Ling! First, we heard her perform *Island Style* by John Cruz: a wonderful Hawaiian song. Tany then changed her instrument from a concert sized ukulele reentrant tuning to a tenor sized instrument (i.e. it is slightly larger in size) to perform *Hi'ilawe*. After the piece, Tany gave us a tour of her ukulele collection consisting of various sizes, tunings, woods, and string materials. The third song is a *E Ku'u Morning Dew* by Eddie Kamae first on a reentrant tuned ukulele then on a low-stringed G instrument, which are some of the different ways of tuning. During the pandemic, Tany then told us about how she discovered bone conduction headphones, which immensely helped her as a musician. The next song we heard was Prince Royce's version of *Stand by Me*–half in English and half in Spanish.

To switch things up, Tany taught us about chord melody—the technique of picking a melody while strumming a chord throughout a song—using another Hawaiian song called *Alona Waltz*. The last song, a contemporary Hawaiian piece, is Daniel Ho's Ho'okahi (In Solitude).
