CI Music Hour 9/22/22

This week, we were lucky to have Gerardo Morales, a Flamenco guitarist and music teacher from the Neighborhood Music School. To start off the session he performed a Sevillana, which is a type of song written in 3 for dancing. Then, Gerardo talked a little about Flamenco music itself, going over techniques such as spiccato, abanico, and tremolo; the need for correct compás or timing; and how much of Flamenco music is built off of the phrygian scale. Furthermore, we also learned about how Flamenco is a mixture of different styles of music including jazz, classical, and Jewish. Then, Gerardo performed two more pieces for us: *Algería* and *Taranta* (a song of lament from Granada).
