Debbie was formerly a music educator in the Conejo Valley Unified and Oak Park Unified School Districts since 1995.

In 2004 -2005 Deborah was selected as the California Young Mother of the Year, and then went on to earn the coveted title of National Young Mother of the Year from American Mothers Inc. Debbie also received the distinguished 2005 Conejo/Las Virgines Future Foundation CLvFFie Award for Community Service, and has received numerous honors for her service to the community. Debbie has served in various leadership positions, including; the Board of Directors of American Mothers Inc., as a volunteer at Ride-On Therapeutic Equestrian Center, as President of the Music Therapy Association of Northridge (MTAN), and is a life member of Hadassah.
