


## **Intersex Health Lunch Talk**

## **ADVANCE Study**

Be a part of history and help change the FDA's discriminatory blood donation policy.

Gay and bisexual men (men who have sex with men) have been restricted from donating blood since 1985 on the basis of fear and without scientific backing. The ADVANCE (Assessing Donor Variability And New Concepts in Eligibility) Study is funded by the FDA and seeks to evaluate alternatives to the FDA's current policy.
