"Don't Say Gay" Florida Bill

New legislation puts limits on LGBTQ education in schools

The Florida state legislature has passed a new bill that restricts the teaching of LGBTQIA subjects in kindergarten through 3rd grade. Additionally, this bill gives parents power to sue schools for teaching LGBTQIA topics and requires teachers to out queer students to parents. Gov. DeSantis is anticipated to sign it into law.
